#### <u>Monthly Board Meeting</u> Monday, November 1, 2021 - 9:30 a.m. Cherokee County Elections & Registration

- <u>Prep for 2022</u> We will be facing several challenges in 2022. The upcoming election has been a good trial run for us. There will be a team meeting on Thursday, November 4 at 9:30 a.m. to review our procedures and start planning how we will handle the workload.
- Poll Worker Training Location for 2022 The City of Canton has agreed to allow us to use the Canton Theatre or the auditorium at the Canton City Hall for poll worker training during the first three weeks of April 2022. We are very excited about the opportunity to use a facility that meets our needs. The City of Canton will not charge us a rental fee.
- Risk Limiting Audit Bradley Myers discussion

Verified Voting's mission is to strengthen democracy for all voters by promoting the responsible use of technology in elections.

"We are a non-partisan organization focused exclusively on the critical role technology plays in election administration. Our staff, Board, and Board of Advisors consist of nationally-recognized subject matter experts on the issue of election integrity and the responsible use of technology. Since our founding in 2004 by computer scientists, we have acted on the belief that the integrity and strength of our democracy rely on citizens' trust that each vote is counted as cast. - Absentee Voting We received a total of 438 ballot applications. We have received 8 applications as of 10/27/2021 that are after the cutoff date. We have been very pleased with Fort Orange Press and would like to continue using their service in 2022. The final absentee voting report is attached.
- <u>Voter Education 2022</u> There are several areas that we plan to focus on in the coming months. SB 202 brought about much change that voters will be unaware of in 2022. We have sent emails and letters to both the local and state parties asking for their assistance in education of voters. (see attached sample letter)
